

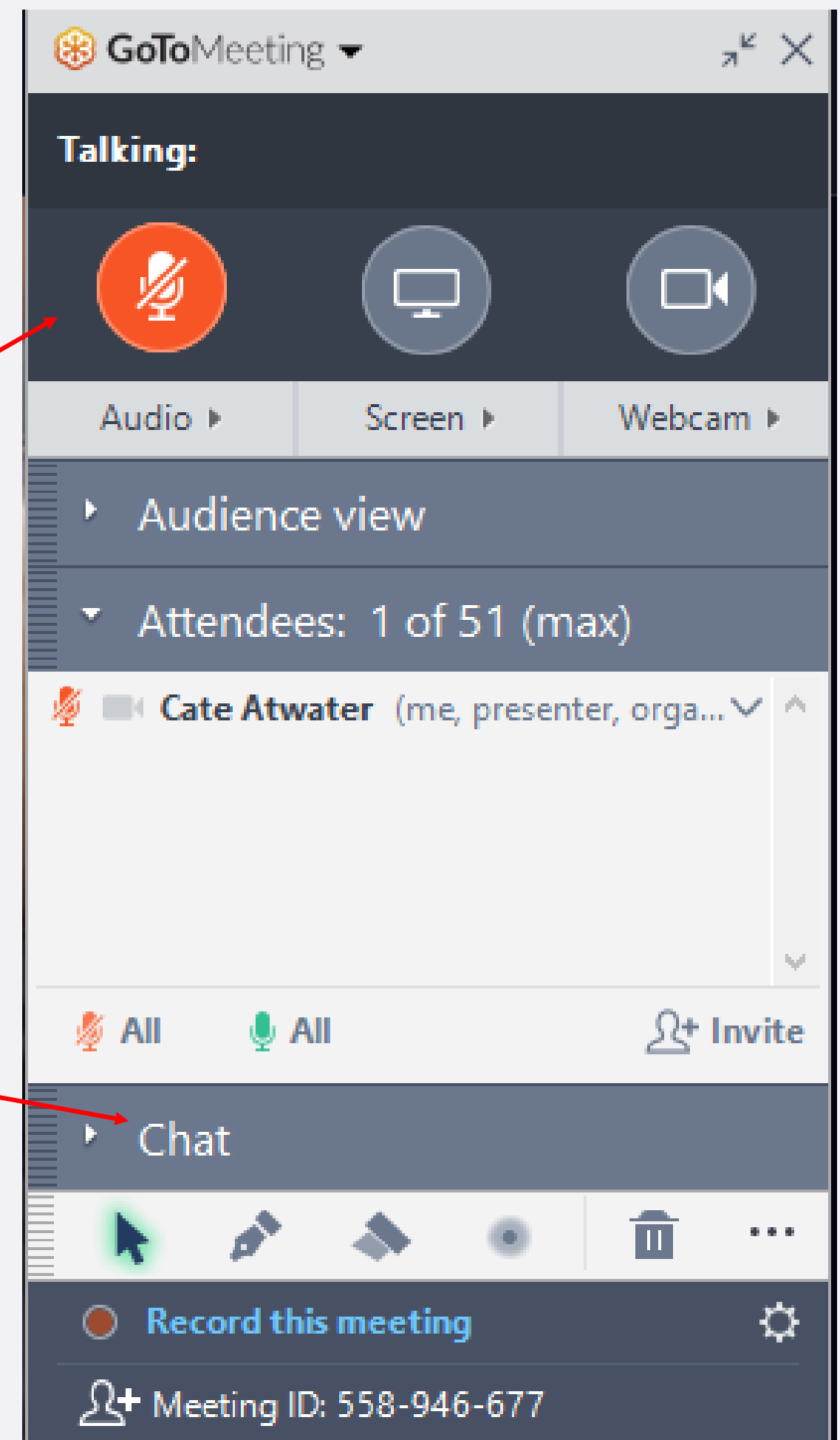

Developing a new service model for the 21st century NHS

Key changes

1. Boosting ‘out-of-hospital’ care bringing, primary and community health services together
2. Redesigning emergency hospital services
3. More personalised care
4. Making better use of digital approaches to care
5. Focusing on population health management

1,000 social prescribing link workers recruited by end of 2020/2021

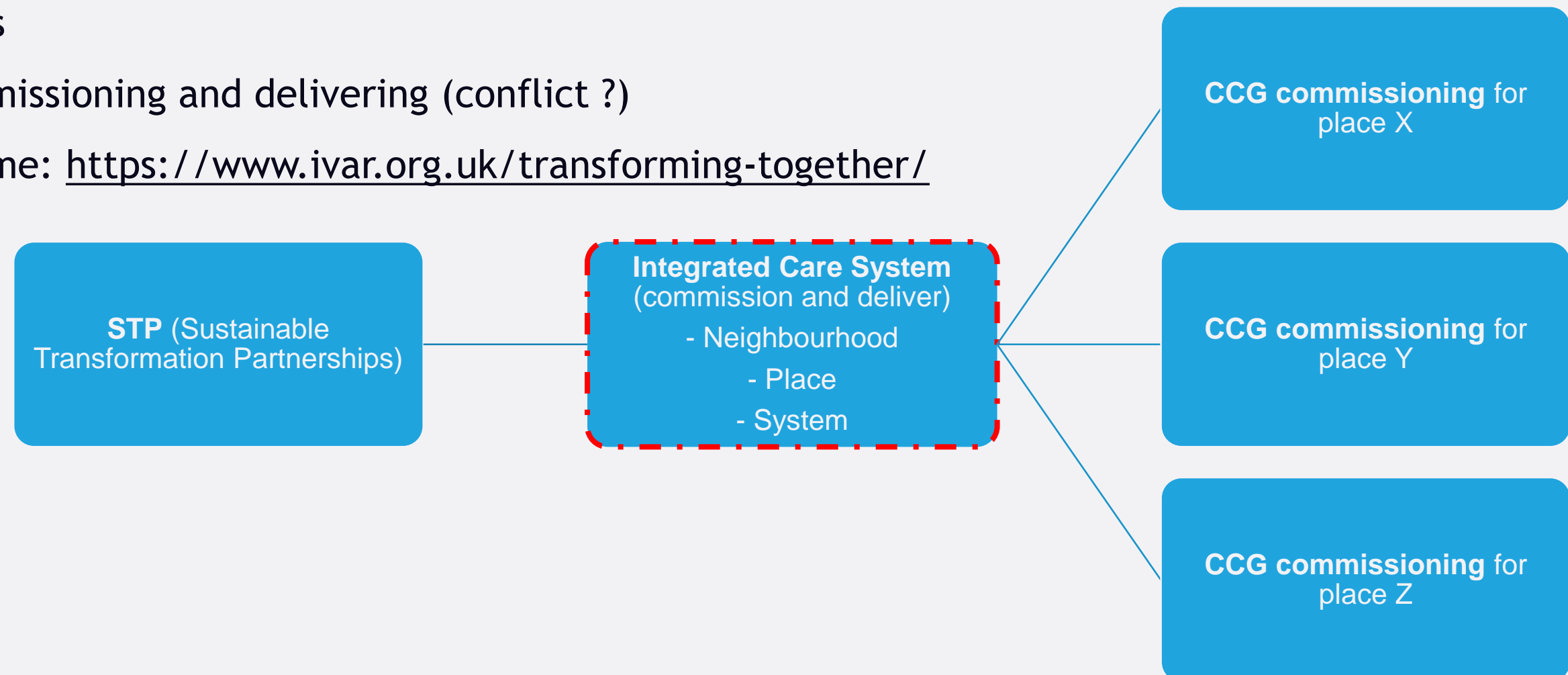
1,200 Primary Care Networks created by July 2019

Backed by additional investment of at least £4.5 billion in primary and community care by 2023/24

Landscape overview (relating to health and social care, 2/2)

- **Change** and keeping up with the change
- Increased focus on culture and wellbeing - 'Culture, Health & Wellbeing Alliance' - strategic partner
- Opportunity to work across adult social care - growth area where members could support
 - Social Care Green Paper?
- Pressures on local government funding = crisis. LGA requesting:
 - Effectively funded authorities, 100% business rate retention, adult care precept, **devolution**, local taxation controls
- NHS Long Term Plan commitments to the sector
- Significant desire to involve charities and social enterprises (from NHS England perspective), and public leisure and culture
- (Trying) to work with integrated care systems
- CCGs merging, Integrated Care Systems commissioning and delivering (conflict ?)

Potential priority topics for the SIG

- Change the **name** of the Special Interest Group to health & social care, and work across leisure and cultural services
- Preparing for **devolution**
- Follow up with **NHS England** after ‘Transforming Healthcare Together’ conference
 - NHS England re. engaging leisure and culture at national level, and where do charities and social enterprises fit
 - NCVO and NHS England support for members with engaging with Integrated Care Systems - how engage?
 - Definite opportunity for GMActive to engage here
 - Integrated Care Systems and STPs - sharing experiences, engaging with and trust's involvement etc.,
- **Social prescribing**
 - NHS aim of new Link Workers - DCMS update
 - Engagement from Association of Link Workers, keen to become involved with members
- **Adult social care** - sharing experiences, service delivery etc
- Engaging & influencing the **LGA** (Local Government Association) and **ADPH** (Ass. of Directors of Public Health)
 - Working with Jim McManus at ADPH on resource on trust model supporting local and national health priorities
- Re-establishing the trust’s **exercise referral network**
- **Shared experiences** on commissions & developments e.g. what is working, what is happening for trust’s locally etc
- Landscape scanning

Immediate opportunities for members

- Alzheimer's Society - Caitlin
 - Dementia Friendly Guidance out and held webinar for members
 - Keen to understand the industry (query culture too?) and what the industry might look like in the future.
 - Keen and present partner - how can we support?
- Momenta
 - Request to scope working with members: child weight management, diabetes, and adult weight management
 - Momenta develop programmes and licence them (Mytime Active and Active Northumberland involved)
 - Licencing arrangement
 - Worth a specific conference call with members and Momenta?
