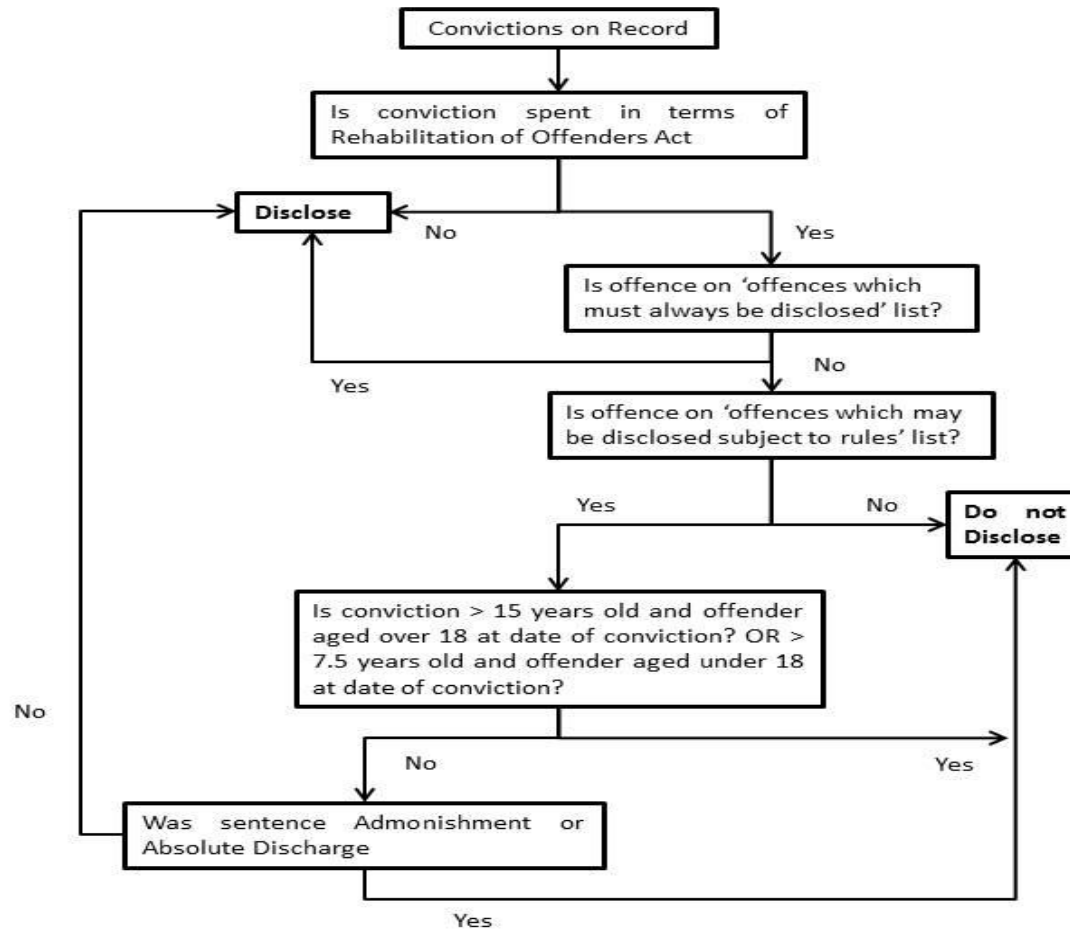

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2015 Changes to Disclosure Regime in Scotland



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Scenario 1

Tony has applied for PVG as he will be teaching children's classes in your leisure centre. He has a conviction for attempted murder in 1994 (when he was 20) and received a two year custodial sentence.

The conviction is 'spent'. This will be disclosed as this is an offence on the 'always disclose' list.

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Scenario 2

Jane has applied for PVG because she is applying to be a leisure attendant who instructs children and protected adults. Jane has a conviction for assault in 2003 (when she was 25) and she received 100 hours community service.

The conviction is 'spent'. This **may** be disclosed as this is an offence on the 'subject to rules' list but is less than 15 years ago (Jane was an adult when the offence was committed). Jane will receive his copy of the PVG certificate before the College and has a right of appeal to a sheriff.

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Scenario 3

Joan has applied for PVG for her role as a lifeguard in your leisure centre. She has a speeding conviction from 2010, for which she received a £750 fine.

The conviction is 'spent'. The type of offence does not appear on either the 'always disclosure' or 'subject to rules' list.

When the conviction is spent, it is not disclosed, no matter the level of disclosure.

Protecting Vulnerable Groups Scheme

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HAVE YOU EVER WORKED WITH CHILDREN OR PROTECTED ADULTS?

If the answer is "yes" then you will probably be a member of the PVG Scheme administered by Disclosure Scotland.

This means that you will be subject to ongoing monitoring (continuous updating) in order to keep your vetting information up to date.

Have your personal/contact details changed?

Are you unsure whether you are part of the PVG Scheme?

Do you wish to leave the PVG Scheme?

It is crucial that we have the correct personal details on record for you in order to maintain our safeguarding role in Scotland.

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Your 'duty to refer'

Whether or not in the course of the individual's work, an individual in regulated work:

- Harmed a child
- Placed a child at risk of harm
- Inappropriate conduct involving pornography
- Inappropriate conduct of a sexual nature involving a child, or
- Given inappropriate medical treatment to a child

AND

**You have dismissed or removed the person from regulated work
BECAUSE OF A REFERRAL GROUND**
